## Could you translate that to Lutheran please?

If someone said to you, “Could you tell the congregation something from your Christian life that will encourage them?” What would you say?

During the opportunity to speak at a Baptist service, I was asked to, “give my testimony.” What is a “testimony”? Do Lutherans do that?

Webster says this about “testimony,” tes·ti·mo·ny

In the Bible, the “Ark of the Covenant,” (similar in size, shape and symbolism to our altar) was often called, “The Ark of the Testimony.” The Bible also refers to the Ten Commandments as a testimony, “When the Lord finished speaking to Moses on Mount Sinai, He gave him the two tablets of the Testimony, the tablets of stone inscribed by the finger of God” (Exodus 31:18). “In simplicity, testimony is a “reliable word of truth.”

And so, what did those folks

at the Baptist church mean when they said, “Would you mind giving your testimony?” Translated into Lutheran, they were saying, “Could you tell the congregation something from your Christian life that will encourage them?” In some churches, “To give your testimony,” may mean, “Tell us how you came to faith.”

On the day I was at the Baptist church, two others gave their testimonies before me. Both told simple yet moving accounts from their past, about what God was doing in their lives in specific situations. The congregation was used to this. During the other’s testimonies there was an occasional, “Amen” and even some applause.

A testimony is essentially a word of encouragement, giving God the credit for something in our lives. It’s that simple.

And why don’t Lutherans give testimonies in worship? Might some think it comes across “showy,” or vain? Might it be that our Lutheran worship is altar-centered; Word-centered, not person-centered? Yes, that might true. Do we shy away from this because we could end up with a label that would identify us as fanatical about our faith, too enthusiastic, or too religious? Should these concerns stop us from sharing what God is doing in our lives? No. Do those who give testimonies have something they can teach us?

Worship is celebrating and expressing His work and activity in our lives. They say in overseas missionary circles, after the pastor

gives his message, others will standup and give, “add-ons.” Personal words from the worshippers on how the sermon applies to their lives, or they may give a verse that has come to mind that builds on the encouragement of the sermon. Is that risky for the pastor, letting the congregation possibly get out of control with enthusiasm? Yes, but not to the point of fear.

Is there a balance somewhere, a time and a place for the individual to share what God is actually doing in their lives? Would that be encouraging for the family of God? You bet!

More important than sharing a testimony publicly, is just being aware that He is indeed active in our lives, not just the lives of others. What is He doing in your life? What has He done lately? Could you put it into words? Have you stopped to think about it? Do you share this with the most important people in your life?

What if someone said to you, “Could you tell the congregation something from your Christian life that will encourage them?” What would you say?

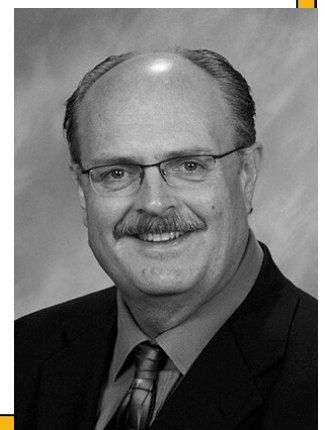
## Check lost and found before winter

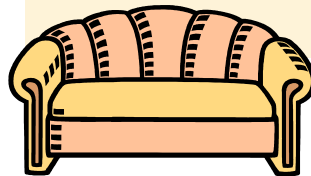

## Missionaries visit Our Saviour Lutheran Church Aug. 18

My name is Elliot Derricks and my fiancée is Serena Little. I am from Denmark, Wis. and I am 24 years old. Serena is from Buckley, Was. (near Seattle) and is 23 years old. We are missionaries going to serve the Lord in Macau, an S.A.R. of China. I served through Lutheran Church Missouri Synod World Mission in Slovakia last year, and Serena served in Macau last year as well. We met at the LCMS missionary training in Chicago and will be getting married on October 15.

Serena will be working at the Concordia English Center, run by the LCMS. Serena, accompanied by CEC staff, teach English and share the gospel. I will be teaching English as a second language at a local school in

Macau while volunteering at the CEC with Serena as well.

First and foremost, Serena and I ask that you pray for us. Pray that God will use us to boldly proclaim the Gospel that God would bless the CEC, and that God would bless our first year of marriage there.

Finally, Serena and I ask that you prayerfully consider partnering with us financially in bringing Jesus to Macau. The total cost of our service is around \$2,000 a month for the 18 months we will serve there. The best way for you to support us financially is through a monthly pledge. ## GriefShare program returns to OSLC

This 13 week program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of loved ones. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by small group discussions. Past participants have related how helpful the information and follow-up discussions were to them.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or family have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to store their grief instead

of allowing it to do the God-given work for which it is intended. Don't allow fear of what others may think keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member or friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the

symptoms of being stuck in grief and that you do not need to live in bondage to certain emotions. You will learn valuable information about facing your new normal in life and renewing your hope for the future. Grief-related books/materials are available for participants to borrow.

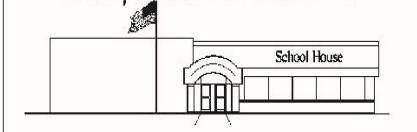
