How is it possible for a people to work against themselves? That is almost a paradox! That would be like a guy trying to walk and trip himself at the same time!

Here is a list of synonyms for the term "fifth column:"

"adversary, agent, an tagonist, archenemy, asperser, assailant, assassin, attacker, back biter, bad person, bandit, betrayer, calumniator, competitor, contender, criminal, defamer, defiler, detractor, disputant, emulator, falsifier, foe, guerrilla, informer, inquisitor, invader, murderer, opponent, opposition, other side, prosecutor, rebel, revolutionary, rival, saboteur, seditionist, slanderer, spy, terrorist, traducer, traitor, vilifier, villain." In Biblical

language, we add, "Sin, flesh, carnal nature, old Adam, etc"

Apply those terms to yourself. Could it be that we have an "inner-other," another force living in us that works against ourselves, that rebel and tries to ruin our efforts? That almost sounds like Doctor Jekyll and Mr. Hyde! Not me, I am not two-faced!

When we work against ourselves, or do something contrary to our principles or pull the rug out from under our own intentions, don't you wonder what causes that?

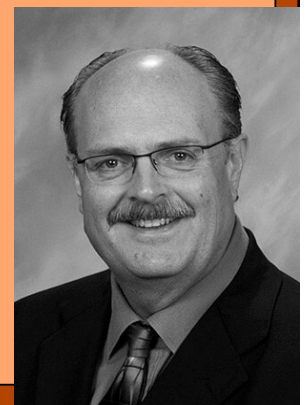
For example, someone goes on a diet but then cheats, intentionally, and then lives in regret and they are angry at oneself. The examples are endless. They worked against themselves. They sabotaged their own efforts.

Webster's dictionary describes the term "fifth column" as "a group of secret sympathizers or supporters of an enemy that engage in espionage or sabotage within defense lines or national borders." The term's origin: Name applied to rebel

sympathizers in Madrid in 1936 when four rebel columns were advancing on the city. First known use [was in] 1936."

A "Fifth Column," in military applications, may try to organize a "coup" [overturn, upset] in the government.

Have you ever read St. Paul speech in the closing verses of Romans 7? He speaks about a sort of "inner saboteur (A "fifth column"). He calls it by name, shines the light on it, and what was a mysterious culprit hiding in the dark basement of our being is now cornered. His eyes a glowing in the light and he has a name... "Sin living in me." "The flesh." "The old Adam." "The carnal nature," "the lower nature."

## Paul helps us understand the fifth column

If we were to take Paul's words in Romans 7, and convert them into what might appear as an urgent telegraph message from a single military commander from his outpost that has just been overrun by the enemy, that message might read something like this...

"There is a fifth column within the outpost that I cannot overpower. It has taken me by a 'coup' and overturned my control and seized my command (or mind). It is a force bigger than I can handle. Who will rescue me? I am dying! Send help!"

Now read the actual words of Paul in Romans 8, "Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me. **22** For in my inner being I delight in God's law; **23** but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me. **24** What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death?"

Paul was not only talking about the "salvation" of his body and soul, but also about wanting a rescue from the inner fifth column that kept causing him to sabotage himself. That is, he wanted to stop working against himself.

Once Paul could identify that culprit, shine the light on

him and give him a name, "Sin living in me" also known as "The flesh," he was off to a good start.

The 10 Commandments shown the light to reveal the problem was sin, and the Savior was the Mighty Rescuer who set Paul free.

Read on in chapter eight where Paul states that he can no longer be in charge of his mind, for it is so prone to being taken over again by that fifth column. Paul says in Romans 8:6, "his mind must now be controlled by the Holy Spirit." The Holy Spirit came alive in you in Baptism. Your faith needs watering just like the grass. Keep it alive through active worship, fellowship and study of the Word.

In the four free gifts, this concept about "daily doing battle against the fifth column" falls under "He walks with me", that is, living the Christian life. Come to our Bible classes to learn more about the four free gifts and how the Word can take deeper root in your faith-walk and conduct.

It was Luther's inner fifth column that brought him to a deep need for the grace of Christ, as seen through the Reformation. That rescue of Christ was His Love. Our Response, joyfully serve The One who rescued us!

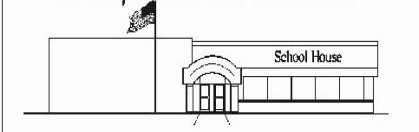
